## Possible Engine Seminar

Gary Duff and I have talked of a Seminar at which Gary would demonstrate the process for replacing the rear main seal; without removing the crankshaft. The demonstration would require a 1946 to 1948 V-8 engine (59A) which is in need of a rear seal but that is otherwise in good condition. The engine must be removed from the car and the oil drained. The pan must be removed with the engine upright to drain as much oil as possible from the crankshaft cavity and pan. After draining and cleaning, the pan would be put back on for transportation to the Seminar site. Gary would then mount the engine a stand and turn it crankshaft up for the show and tell. The main issue is that we need a suitable engine. If you have one or know of an engine which would benefit from this service, please let either Gary or myself know and we can make arrangements and schedule a date for the Seminar. The Seminar would certainly benefit one Club member and should provide useful information to others.
