I believe that most of you know that the Spring Seattle Auto Swap Meet is sponsored by the Puget Sound Regional Group #18 of the Early Ford V8 club of America and is the main source of income for our club's activities.

Our club has 220 members (75 of whom are spouses).

Our club has 8 members (2 of whom are spouses) that live out of state.

Our club has 14 members (4 of whom are spouses) that live 100 – 300 mi. from Monroe.

Our club has 10 members (7 of whom are spouses) that live 75 – 100 mi. from Monroe.

Our club has 188 members (62 of whom are spouses) that live less than 75 mi. from Monroe.

The 100 – 300 mi. group volunteer at a 28% rate.

The 75 – 100 mi. group volunteer at a 20% rate.

The under 75 mi. group volunteer at a 23% rate.

Over all participation in the Swap Meet by club members is 22.3%
