

The first car driven into Mt. Rainier National Park was in 1907. It was the first National Park to allow visitors to bring motor vehicles inside park boundaries.

When did the first car reach the Paradise portion of the park ? There is a dispute regarding the first car to reach Paradise. In the summer of either 1911 or 1912 (the report says 1912, but a government fiscal year began July 1st in those days), a car with the superintendent as passenger was driven to Paradise Meadow. In the fall of 1911, President Taft was driven to Paradise. The car became stuck in several areas of the muddy road and had to be helped by a mule team. Source https://www.nps.gov/mora/index.htm




