



How many of you have gone to look at an Early V8, and ended up finding other unanticipated treasures? Story and photos from Guy Generaux

PSRG member Guy Generaux was recently snooping around an industrial area near the Palm Springs Airport to get a better look at remnants of a couple old Fords in a vacant lot. Slipping through a hole in the fence he snapped pics of a '50 Ford sedan and what remains of either a chopped-up '47 Ford convertible or woodie wagon. The '50 still has the flathead under the hood. In an attempt to learn more, Guy entered an open door of a building nearby, where he discovered several cars housed (mostly '60's -'70's models). Nobody seemed to be around.

Guy proceeded through the warehouse to an open storage yard where he encountered quite a surprise: two 1941 Dodge coupes that had been spliced together! A worker came in - he knew little about the Early V8s next door, other than some homeless folks frequently hung out at one corner of the lot. He related the story he heard behind the two-way Dodge oddity: it served as a factory promotional vehicle and three were originally produced. Guy was able to snap a few photos with his cell phone before leaving. Back home he conducted an online search. Seems the Dodge was likely a one-of-a-kind brainchild of a fellow named Charles Pine, as detailed in an old newspaper article. The search also led to a 2021 posting of the car advertised for sale on craigslist in the LA area. There's no information on who purchased the car, but somehow it has made its way to Palm Springs. Having retailed for US \$1.88, in 1961 the 'Auto Strap' was described as a tool that "guards your child as you're busy driving through traffic", and was designed for ages one to ten. It also claimed to allow one's child to "sit, stand, kneel or sleep without disturbing the driver" and also "prevents spills from sudden stops".
