A weathered early 1900s barn surrounded by expansive mowed fields provided the backdrop as we parked our V8s near the building. Those on tour who drove modern wheels were relegated to a different area so we could get some nice photo-ops of the flatheads. Proprietor Sandy Keys (and a crew of a half dozen helpers) were waiting for us. Roughly 40 cars filled the barn and an attached extension. All cars are outfitted with covers when not being shown. It takes no small effort to remove the covers for display. Sandy provided some fascinating history of his collection and also the upstairs loft which housed a diverse compilation of historical artifacts, many local. Sandy is an avid Lincoln enthusiast. An array of V12s and later models were interspersed within the fleet. Among the most interesting was a 1940 all-original convertible. Some '47-49 models were very compelling and a 1956 Mark 2 was impeccably restored. Also, a super-rare 1959 Mark 3 convertible stole the spotlight. A smattering of Mercurys were in the mix, including a gorgeous '54 Sun Valley. Two of Sandy's team tended an antique mahogany backbar, distributing soft drinks and brews to our congregation. The hospitality was amazing, and Sandy - a gracious host.



Less than a ten-minute drive, we checked in at the newly-remodeled Sequim Holiday Inn Express. Happy hour on the rooftop deck commenced at 5:30 and by 6:15 a dozen pizzas arrived. The camaraderie and social time was terrific as we enjoyed our food and drink well into the evening. It was forecast some mild precipitation might appear Sunday, however it was still dry outside when we gathered for the complimentary hotel breakfast buffet in the morning. Alas, light rain began to fall as we finished up and headed to Port Townsend for a visit to the always-interesting Bergstrom's Auto Collectibles emporium. The place is filled with all assortments of literature, parts, nostalgia, signage, vehicles and more. Several members of the local Rakers Car Club were on hand, serving coffee and cookies to our group. Moderate rain put a damper on the day as members dispersed to their various home ports. 


